Elizabeth Denham, CIPP

Assistant Privacy Commissioner of Canada

Effective November 1, 2007, Elizabeth Denham was appointed Assistant Privacy Commissioner of Canada with primary responsibility for the federal private sector privacy law; the Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act (PIPEDA). Immediately prior to this appointment, she served as Director of Research, Analysis and Stakeholder Relations with the Office of the Privacy Commissioner of Canada.

From 2003 to 2007, Ms. Denham was Director, Private Sector, for the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Alberta. In this role, she established and directed the compliance and enforcement program for Alberta's private sector privacy law.

From 2001 to 2003, Ms. Denham ran her own privacy policy consulting business that included public sector and private sector clients in Alberta, British Columbia, Manitoba and Ontario. Working with the Calgary Health Region from 1997 to 2001, she held the positions of Information and Privacy Coordinator and Director, Legal and Regulatory Affairs. Ms. Denham also served as the public member on the Research Ethics Board, University of Calgary.

Joseph Bozic

President, dataXile Corp.

Joseph Bozic is the founder and president of dataXile – a company that provides information destruction solutions to organizations seeking to retire obsolete computers without risking unauthorized disclosure of the data residing on the hard drive. Mr. Bozic has been instrumental in advancing information protection and responsible disposal, having served on the NAID-Canada Board of Directors since 2006. Joseph is often called on to write and speak on issues related to electronic information destruction.

Ken Clupp, CD, P.Eng., C.Tech., PSP

Senior Technical Security Consultant – RCMP Technical Security Branch

Ken Clupp is a Senior Technical Security Consultant with the RCMP Technical Security Branch (TSB). He is responsible for the content of the RCMP Security Equipment Guide (SEG). The SEG provides approved equipment lists and user guidance for physical security equipment – including equipment used for the destruction of information on paper and IT media. In addition to running the RCMP's destruction equipment test program, Ken provides advice and guidance on a variety of physical and technical security topics to federal government departments and has authored numerous security guides and advisories. Ken is also the Secretary of the Advisory Committee on Physical Security (ACOPS).

Ken is a former military engineering officer, retiring from the Canadian Forces with 30 years of service. Ken attended the Royal Military College of Canada (RMC) and graduated with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. He has worked in a variety of technical, staff and leadership positions throughout his career and had postings throughout Canada. He joined the RCMP in 2004.

Ric Handren, CPP

Director Protection Services, Royal Bank of Canada

Ric's mandate is to oversee the safety and security of personnel, assets, facilities, operations and hard copy information world wide for RBC. This entails all operations involving 72,000 employees in 34 countries.

Prior to joining RBC 5 years ago, Ric held a similar position with Imperial Oil. Ric also served in the Royal Canadian Mounted Police for over 20 years, where he specialized in national and international commercial crime investigations.
